# Foreword

New users of *American Literary Scholarship* should know something about the content and format of the series. Each volume surveys work published during the year specified in the title and on the spine. Because every book and essay discussed in the volume is presumed to have been published in that year, bibliographical citations omit year of publication as a redundant detail. Occasionally a chapter contributor reaches back to items from the year or two previous that have been missed in earlier discussions; in those instances year of publication is specified. Chapters in Part I of the volume focus on individual authors or critically affiliated groups of authors; those in Part II scan historical periods and genres. Coverage is selective, not comprehensive: contributors are charged with discussing significant work, not all work, and are to be silent about the rest except to warn against the especially unsatisfactory. For efficiency of space, bibliographical citation employs standard MLA abbreviations for journals and series, abbreviated names for publishers, and abbreviated titles for works—especially Festschriften and essay collections—cited multiple times. The “Key to Abbreviations” following this foreword supplies expanded information for all three of these categories. Finally, only print publication is eligible for coverage: *AmLS* is as much an historical as a critical record, intended to point readers to vital and accessible contributions to the study of American literature; electronic publication, popular and pervasive though it may be, still lacks dependable mechanisms for permanence.

The series editors are grateful to those Americanists who commit their time and energies to the demands of preparing chapters. Joining the enterprise in the present volume are Dennis Berthold, Texas A&M University, who undertakes the “Melville” chapter; Ann Moseley, Texas A&M University, Commerce (the Cather portion of “Wharton and

Cather”); Jayme Stayer, Loyola University, Chicago (the Eliot portion of “Pound and Eliot”); Ed Piacentino, High Point University (“Early-19th-Century Literature”); Nicolas S. Witschi, Western Michigan University (“Late-19th-Century Literature”); and Camille Norton, University of the Pacific (“Poetry: 1900 to the 1940s”). There are no sections on French or German contributions in “Scholarship in Languages Other Than English” this year, though Françoise Clary will supply the French coverage next year after a brief hiatus and Thomas Austenfeld, North Georgia College and State University, will step into the German post. Keiko Beppu, Matsuyama Shinonome College, returns to supply the biennial survey of Japanese scholarship. And Zoltán Abádi-Nagy, University of Debrecen (Hungary), and Elżbieta H. Oleksy, University of Łódź (Poland), return after a three-year hiatus to identify Eastern European publications over that period.

Next year will see further changes of the guard. Andrew Smith, Lafayette College, and Elizabeth Wright, Pennsylvania State University, Hazelton, succeed Thomas R. Mitchell (“Hawthorne”). William Pannacker, Hope College, and Paul Crumbley, Utah State, take over for M. Jimmie Killingsworth (“Whitman and Dickinson”). Elisabeth Daumer, Eastern Michigan University, succeeds Jayme Stayer (the Eliot portion of “Pound and Eliot”). Teresa Towner, University of Texas, Dallas, succeeds Joseph R. Urgo (“Faulkner”). Kristin Boudreau, University of Georgia, follows Ed Piacentino (“Early-19th-Century Literature”). Matthew Hofer, University of New Mexico, replaces Camille Norton (“Poetry: 1900 to the 1940s”). Dorothy Chansky, Texas Tech University, succeeds James J. Martine, whose dozen essays on “Drama” make his the longest tenure among the departing contributors. M. Giulia Fabi, University of Ferrara, replaces Maria Anita Stefanelli (“Italian Contributions”). Liz Kella, Södertörns University College, succeeds Bo G. Ekelund as the Swedish representative to “Scandinavian Contributions.” And Antonio Marquez, University of New Mexico, returns for his biennial survey of “Spanish Contributions.” A warm welcome to these new contributors, and even warmer thanks to departing colleagues for their fine work.

The editors are grateful to their English departments at the University of New Mexico and Indiana University for general support in the production of these volumes, to the staff of the Center for Bibliographic Services of MLA for supplying a preprint of relevant portions of the *International Bibliography* for use by *AmLS* contributors, and to the



journals editorial and production staff at Duke University Press for smoothing the transition to the all-electronic management of manuscripts and proofs introduced for the first time this year. Authors and publishers are invited to direct to Professor Nordloh review copies and offprints for consideration in these pages.
