

Errata

In a recently published paper by J. E. Caldwell *et al.* (ANESTHESIOLOGY 70:31–35, 1989), mivacurium chloride was incorrectly referred to as the registered trademark for Burroughs Wellcome Company's short-acting neuromuscular blocking agent presently undergoing clinical testing. Mivacurium chloride is the generic name of this agent; the trademark remains to be selected.

In the May, 1989 issue, the article by Schwartz *et al.* (Schwartz AE, Maneksha FR, Kanchuger MS, Sidhu US, Poppers PJ: Flumazenil decreases the minimum alveolar concentration of isoflurane in dogs. ANESTHESIOLOGY 70:764–766, 1989) contained an error. On page 766, line 10 should read as follows: Furthermore, in the hot plate test in rats, low doses of flumazenil caused analgesia, whereas high doses did not.²⁰

In the June, 1989 issue of ANESTHESIOLOGY, the article by Katsuoka *et al.* (Katsuoka M, Kobayashi K, Ohnishi ST: Volatile anesthetics decrease calcium content of isolated myocytes. ANESTHESIOLOGY 70:954–960, 1989), published in the category of Clinical Investigation, should have been published in the category of Laboratory Investigation.
