JOSÉ DEUSTUA is a Peruvian-born sociologist and historian who earned his doctorate at the Ecole des Hautes Etudes en Sciences Sociales, Paris. Currently he is assistant professor of Latin American history at the University of Illinois, Chicago. He is the author of *La minería peruana y la iniciación de la República* (1986) and, with José Luis Rénique, of *Intelectuales, indigenismo, y descentralismo en el Perú, 1897–1931* (1984); and editor, with Rénique and José Matos Mar, of *Luis E. Valcárcel, Memorias* (1981). Currently he is completing a book on the mining export system and the domestic market in nineteenth-century Peru.

RAÚL GARCÍA HERAS is assistant professor of economic history at the University of Buenos Aires and research fellow of Argentina's National Scientific Research Council (CONICET). He earned the Ph.D. from the University of La Plata. He recently completed a history of the Anglo Argentine Tramways Company, 1876–1981, and is currently investigating the links between foreign investments, international financial relations, and economic policymaking in Argentina between 1955 and 1966.
