ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND COUNCILORS AT 23rd ANNUAL MEETING

The Twenty-third Annual Meeting of the American Diabetes Association was held in Atlantic City June 15-16, 1963. At the Business Session on June 16, Thomas P. Sharkey, M.D., Dayton, was elected President for the 1963-64 organizational year, to succeed Jerome W. Conn, M.D., of Ann Arbor.

Rachmiel Levine, M.D., New York, was elected President-Elect, and Thaddeus S. Danowski, M.D., Pittsburgh, Vice President. Laurentius O. Underdahl, M.D., Rochester, Minnesota, and Edwin W. Gates, M.D., Niagara Falls, were re-elected Secretary and Treasurer, respectively. Dr. Sharkey served in 1962-63 as First Vice President, while Dr. Levine was Second Vice President and Dr. Danowski was a member of the Council.

The Council of the Association has been renamed the Board of Directors, and its members are listed on the masthead above. For the three-year term expiring in 1966, the following were re-elected Directors: William H. Grishaw, M.D., Beverly Hills; George J. Hamwi, M.D., Columbus, Ohio; Henry E. Oppenheimer, M.D., St. Louis; and Priscilla White, M.D., Boston.

James B. Hurd, M.D., Chicago, and William R. Jordan, M.D., Richmond, were re-elected Chairman and Vice Chairman, respectively, of the Assembly of State Coordinators and Affiliate Delegates (formerly the Assembly of State Governors and Affiliate Delegates). Both Dr. Hurd and Dr. Jordan by reason of holding the above-mentioned offices were re-elected to the Board of Directors for a one-year term.

SECOND RESEARCH SYMPOSIUM

October 24-25 is the date of the second Research Symposium of the American Diabetes Association. Entitled "The

Microangiopathy of Diabetes," it will be held at Cherry Hill Inn, Cherry Hill, New Jersey (near Philadelphia).

Honorary and Active Members of the ADA are invited to attend; space permitting, members may apply for registration of nonmember colleagues. The registration fee is \$10.00 plus the cost of two luncheons on the Symposium days. The program, and additional details, will be published in the September-October issue of DIABETES, and will also be mailed to the members along with the registration form.

The Symposium is an activity of the Committee on Research, chaired by Rachmiel Levine, M.D., New York, and will be directed by Alexander Marble, M.D., Boston, a member of that Committee.

FIFTH IDF CONGRESS

The American Diabetes Association is collaborating with the International Diabetes Federation in planning the program of the Fifth Congress to be held July 20-24, 1964, in Toronto, Ontario, Canada. The Annual Meeting of the American Diabetes Association, which had been scheduled for San Francisco in June, immediately preceding the Annual Session of the American Medical Association, has been cancelled. The Fifth Congress will take the place of the usual Scientific Sessions of the Annual Meeting. The ADA's Annual Business Meeting and organizational committee meetings will be held at the time of the Congress.

REVISED CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

The Board of Directors at its meeting on June 14, at the time of the Twenty-third Annual Meeting, adopted a number of amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws, some of which have been indicated on the previous page. The revised Constitution and Bylaws will be printed and sent to the membership in the next month or so.

ARTICLES ON CARBOHYDRATES**

"Carbohydrate: A Key to Diabetes Control," by William H. Olmsted, M.D., and "Carbohydrates in the Diet," by Deaconess Maude Behrman, are featured in the July-August issue of ADA FORECAST. The first deals with starch, sugars, cellulose, and sorbitol; discusses how glucose is used in the body; and the role of carbohydrate in diabetic diets. The second concerns the digestion of carbohydrates, and features recipes including them.

1964 LILLY AWARD

The eighth Lilly Award will be given at the Banquet on July 23, 1964, of the Fifth Congress of the International Diabetes Federation. The following stipulations govern the

contest for this annual award, which is supported by Eli Lilly and Company and consists of \$1,000 and a medal.

Purpose: To recognize demonstrated research in the field of diabetes, taking into consideration independence of thought and originality.

Eligibility: Any investigator in an appropriate field of work, closely related to diabetes, who is less than forty years of age on January 1 of the year in which the award is made. The research will not necessarily be judged in comparison to the work of more mature and experienced workers. The candidate should be a resident of the United States or Canada.

Nominations: Nominations for the award will be solicited from the Members of the American Diabetes Association. Such nominations will be requested by repeated notices to be published in DIABETES. Names of nominees will be sent to the Chairman of the Committee on Scientific Awards and must be received before December 1 of the year preceding the award. The nomination should be accompanied by full information concerning the nominee's personality, training and research work. Six copies of each item should be submitted. No Member may send in more than one nomination. A list of the nominee's publications, if any, and six copies of the publication or manuscript for which the award is to be given should also accompany the nomination. At the discretion of the Committee on Scientific Awards, the award may be given for work published during the year prior to December 1 of the year preceding the award. The nominee should be actively engaged at that time in the line of research for which the award is to be made.

Announcement: The name of the winner will be announced in DIABETES. The winner will be invited to present a paper on his work at the Fifth IDF Congress. Papers considered for the award must be submitted with the idea that they will be published in whole or in part in DIABETES if found acceptable to the Editor and/or Editorial Board. If the Committee should decide that no outstanding work has been presented for this consideration, the award will not be made.

Award: In addition to the monetary award and medal, traveling expenses will be given to make it possible for the recipient to receive his award in person at the Annual Meeting.

INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON PANCREATIC ISLETS

The Swedish Medical Research Council and the Wenner-Gren Foundation will sponsor a three-day international symposium on the structure and metabolism of the pancreatic islets in Uppsala and Stockholm August 30-September 1. The program will deal with the following subjects: 1. Cytology, ultrastructure and histochemistry of the islets; 2. metabolism of the islets; 3. influence of various factors on the islets.
