NEWS OF AFFILIATE ASSOCIATIONS

The FLORIDA DIABETES ASSOCIATION, in conjunction with the Florida State Board of Health, will conduct its Twelfth Annual Seminar on Diabetes and Related Endocrine Disorders on September 30 and October 1 and 2, at the Balmoral Hotel, Miami Beach, in cooperation with the University of Miami School of Medicine, the University of Florida School of Medicine, the Cedars of Lebanon Hospital, the Jackson Memorial Hospital, and the J. Hillis Miller Health Center.

The guest faculty will consist of Eugene Clerkins, M.D., Consultant, Metabolic Division, Lahey Clinic, Boston; Robert Greenblatt, M.D., Professor of Medicine, University of Georgia, Augusta; William R. Kirtley, M.D., Assistant Director, Clinical Research Division, Eli Lilly and Company, Indianapolis; Leo P. Krall, M.D., Senior Consultant, Joslin Clinic and New England Deaconess Hospital, Boston; William Locke, M.D., Associate Clinical Professor of Medicine, Tulane University, New Orleans; C. J. O'Donovan, M.D., Vice President in charge of Research and Medical Affairs, Ames Company, Elkhart, Indiana; and Raymond Randall, M.D., Assistant Professor of Medicine, Graduate School, University of Minnesota, Minneapolis.

Other speakers will be members of the Faculty of the School of Medicine, University of Miami. They are W. A. D. Anderson, M.D.; R. K. Broadway, M.D.; Harvey Blank, M.D.; Michael Goodson, M.D.; B. R. Harrow, M.D.; A. G. Hills, M.D.; R. B. Katims, M.D.; J. B. Miale, M.D.; William Nyhan, M.D.; R. E. Parks, M.D.; W. S. Rogers, M.D.; J. R. Rudnick, M.D.; George F. Schmitt, M.D.; D. L. Seckinger, M.D.; J. A. Sloane, M.D.; Lee Stapp, M.D.; and Warren Witwus, M.D.

The program will open on Wednesday morning, September 30, with "Examination of the Patient for Endocrine Disorders," with Dr. Randall discussing the medical aspects, Dr. Greenblatt the gynecological and Dr. Nyhan the pediatric. Three papers on the pituitary gland will follow: "Clinically Useful Laboratory Aids in the Diagnosis of Pituitary Disorders," by Dr. Seckinger, and two by Dr. Randall, who will discuss "Hyperfunction and Hypofunction of the Anterior Lobe of the Pituitary" and "Hyperfunction and Hypofunction of the Posterior Lobe of the Pituitary." Dr. Schmitt will moderate the morning session.

The afternoon session will be devoted to the thyroid, with Fred Mathers, M.D., as moderator. Among the papers to be presented are "Physiology of the Thyroid: Synthesis, Transport, and Fate of the Thyroid Hormone," by Dr. Greenblatt; "Hyperthyroidism and Hypothyroidism," also by Dr. Greenblatt; "Surgical Evaluation of Patients with Goiter: Colloid, Adenoma (simple, multiple, toxic, nontoxic), Thyroiditis, Cancer," by Dr. Stapp; "Radioactive Iodine in the Diagnosis and Treatment of Thyroid Disorders," by Dr. Parks; "Hyperparathyroidism" and "Hypoparathyroidism," both by Dr. Locke; and "Diagnosis and Treatment of Metabolic Bone Disease," also by Dr. Locke.

On Thursday morning, October 1, the subject for discussion will be the adrenals. Moderator will be R. H. Sinden, M.D. Papers include "Clinically Useful Laboratory Aids in the Diagnosis of Adrenal, Cortical and Medullary Disorders," by Dr. Miale; "The Adrenal Steroids: Natural and Synthetic; Uses and Abuses," by Dr. Randall; "Diagnosis and Treatment of Adrenal Hyperfunction; Cushing's Syndrome," Dr. Katims; and "Diagnosis and Treatment of Adrenal Hypofunction; Addison's Disease; Iatrogenic from Steroid Therapy," Dr. Hills. A paper on "Normal and Abnormal Male and Female Reproductive Physiology" by Dr. Greenblatt will conclude the morning session.

Following the Annual Meeting of the Florida Diabetes Association, the session will continue in the afternoon with G. H. Garmany, M.D., as moderator. Discussions will include "Pathological Anatomy of the Pancreas in Diabetes," by Dr. Anderson; "Insulin Metabolism: Physiology; Role, Action, Release, Hormonal Factors Influencing Action; Nonhormonal Antagonists to Insulin; Insulin Resistance," by Dr. Clerkins; "Alterations in Carbohydrate Metabolism in Diabetes" and "Alterations in Lipid Metabolism in Diabetes," also by Dr. Clerkins; and "Diagnosis of Diabetes, Prediabetes, Latent (Subclinical) and Late Diabetes; Interpretation of Glucose Tolerance Tests," by Dr. Krall.

The Friday morning session on October 2 will feature diabetes. Joseph J. Lowenthal, M.D., will be moderator. The following will comprise the program: "Microangiopathy in Diabetes," by Dr. Krall; "The Juvenile (Youthful) Brittle, Unstable Diabetic," also by Dr. Krall; "Actions, Uses and Abuses of the Oral Drugs" and "Newer Chemical Screening Methods for Diabetes," both by Dr. O'Donovan; and "Current Research—The Insulins" and "Current Research—The Oral Drugs," both by Dr. Kirtley.

Complications of Diabetes will be the topic of the afternoon session, with J. E. Fulghum, M.D., as moderator. Papers will include "Diabetic Ketosis and Acidosis—The Use of Insulin, Fluids and Electrolytes," by Dr. Schmitt; "Pregnancy in Diabetes," by Drs. Rogers and Rudnick; "The Kidneys in Diabetes; Bacilluria, Pyelonephritis (acute and chronic), Papillitis, Intercapillary Glomerulosclerosis," by Drs. Harrow, Sloane and Witwus; "Surgical Aspects of Peripheral Vascular Disease; Endarterectomy, Arterial Graphs, Factors Influencing Choice of Level and Procedure Amputations of the Leg," by Dr. Broadway; "Neurologic Changes in Diabetes: Peripheral Neuritis, Neurogenic Bladder, Neuropathic Joints, Visceral Neuropathy," by Dr. Goodson; and "Dermatology in Diabetes; Latest Research in Skin Manifestations in Diabetes; Lipodystrophy, Xanthosis, Xanthelasma, Xanthoma Diabeticorum, Necrobiosis Lipoidica Diabeticorum," by Dr. Blank.

Kantrow, M.D., Pediatric Staff, Flushing Hospital, Flushing, New York; and Marvin F. Levitt, M.D., Associate Attending Physician, The Mount Sinai Hospital, New York.

The second Symposium will be held in cooperation with the Academy of Medicine of New Jersey and the New Jersey State Department of Health on Tuesday, May 19, from 2 to 4 p.m., at Haddon Hall, Atlantic City, during the Annual Meeting of the Medical Society of New Jersey. The topic will be "Oral Hypoglycemic Agents." Robert H. Areson, M.D., will be the moderator and the following speakers will participate: Charles R. Shuman, M.D., Clinical Professor of Medicine, Temple University, Philadelphia; Martin G. Goldner, M.D., Professor of Medicine, State University of New York; and LeRoy Pesch, M.D., Associate Professor of Medicine, Rutgers University Medical School.

The NEW YORK DIABETES ASSOCIATION (Clinical Society) will hold its Twelfth Annual Symposium on Saturday, October 10, at the Barbizon-Plaza Hotel, New York City.

The morning program, beginning at 9:30, will be devoted to "Hypoglycemic States." Among the papers to be given are "Classification and Diagnostic Considerations of Hypoglycemia," by Holbrooke S. Seltzer, M.D., Associate Professor of Internal Medicine, University of Texas, Southwestern Medical School, Dallas; "Dynamics of Insulin Secretion in Hypoglycemia," by Rosalyn S. In the afternoon the chief topic will be "Inter-Relationship of Carbohydrate and Fat Metabolism." Papers will include "Regulation of Fat Storage and Release," by Howard A. Eder, M.D., Professor of Medicine, Albert Einstein College of Medicine, Yeshiva University, Bronx, New York; "Mechanisms of Ketogenesis and Hyperketonemia," by George F.
