1966 LILLY AWARD DEADLINE

December 1 is the deadline for receipt of nominations for the tenth Lilly Award which will be given at the Banquet on June 25, 1966, of the Twenty-sixth Annual Meeting of the American Diabetes Association. The annual award consists of \$1,000 and a medal. It is supported by Eli Lilly and Company. The following stipulations govern the contest:

Eligibility: Any investigator in an appropriate field of work, closely related to diabetes, who is less than forty years of age on January 1 of the year in which the award is made. The research will not necessarily be judged in comparison to the work of more mature and experienced workers. The candidate should be a resident of the United States or Canada.

Nominations: Nominations for the award will be solicited from the Members of the American Diabetes Association. Such nominations will be requested by repeated notices to be published in DIABETES. Names of nominees will be sent to the Chairman of the Committee on Scientific Awards and must be received before December 1 of the year preceding the award. The nomination should be accompanied by full information concerning the nominee's personality, training and research work. Six copies of each item should be submitted. No member may send in more than one nomination. A list of the nominee's publications, if any, and six copies of the publication or manuscript for which the award is to be given should also accompany the nomination. At the discretion of the Committee on Scientific Awards, the award may be given for work published during the year prior to December 1 of the year preceding the award. The nominee should be actively engaged at that time in the line of research for which the award is to be made.

Announcement: The name of the winner will be announced in DIABETES. The winner will be invited to present a paper on his work at the Annual Meeting. Papers considered for the award must be submitted with the idea that they will be published in whole or in part in DIABETES if found acceptable to the Editor and/or Editorial Board. If the Committee should decide that no outstanding work has been presented for this consideration, the award will not be made.

Award: In addition to the monetary award and medal, traveling expenses will be given to make it possible for the recipient to receive his award in person at the Annual Meeting.

The DIABETES ASSOCIATION OF OREGON sponsored a Hypoglycemic Symposium when it held its Annual Meeting on November 27 at the Benson Hotel, Portland. On the previous afternoon a "Workshop on Diets and Diet Calculation for Doctors, Nurses, Diet Supervisors in Nursing Homes, Etc.," was held in the Auditorium of Good Samaritan Hospital.

Rudolph M. Crommelin, M.D., President of the Oregon Affiliate, presided over the morning session of the Symposium at which Stefan S. Fajans, M.D., Professor of Medicine, University of Michigan Medical School, Ann Arbor, Michigan, was guest speaker. He spoke on "Spontaneous Hypoglycemia— with Recent Advances in Differential Diagnosis." Dr. Fajans later addressed a luncheon meeting on the subject: "Insulin Secretion under Physiologic and Pathologic Conditions." Also on the morning program was a paper by Robert T. Hare, M.D., entitled "Glucagon Reviewed," and a panel on "Experiences with Hypoglycemia in the Nondiabetic," with H. Kammer, M.D., as Moderator. The afternoon session was chaired by John W. Stephens, M.D., and consisted of a paper by Robert Dow, M.D., on "Neurological Manifestations and Complications of Hypoglycemia," and a panel on "Recognition and Treatment of Hypoglycemia in the Diabetic," with James Kuhl, M.D., as Moderator. Dr. Fajans concluded with a summary and comments.
