25th ANNUAL MEETING JUNE 19-20, 1965

The Twenty-fifth Annual Meeting of the American Diabetes Association will be held at the Hotel Roosevelt in New York City on Saturday and Sunday, June 19-20, immediately prior to the annual session of the American Medical Association, June 20-24.

Pertinent information about the Meeting, together with a hotel reservation card, was mailed to Members of the Association in November. *Those who plan to attend the Meeting and desire to stay at the Hotel Roosevelt should complete the card and send it directly to the hotel as soon as possible.* It is anticipated that there will be sufficient rooms for use by Members during the ADA Meeting, as well as during the American Medical Association Annual Convention. In the event that there is a shortage of rooms, assignment will be made by the hotel in the order in which reservations are received.

Among highlights of the Meeting will be the presentation on Saturday, June 19, of the Banting Memorial Lecture by Solomon A. Berson, M.D. Dr. Berson is Chief, Radioisotope Service, Veterans Administration Hospital, Bronx, New York.

The Annual Banquet and Social Hour will be held Saturday evening, June 19. Members, their families, and friends are cordially invited to attend both functions. A Banquet reservation form will be mailed to all Members in advance of the Meeting.

SCIENTIFIC PROGRAM

Saturday, June 19, and Sunday, June 20, are the dates for the Scientific Sessions. The titles of papers to be presented, those to be read by title, and other pertinent information,

will be published in this Journal. The Program, as a separate publication, including abstracts of all papers, will be sent in advance to the Members. In addition, the abstracts will be published in the issue of DIABETES immediately following the Meeting.

Physicians and other scientists who would like to present papers at the Scientific Sessions are invited to submit abstracts to L. O. Underdahl, M.D., Chairman of the Committee on Scientific Programs, in care of the national office at 18 East 48th Street, New York, New York 10017. Seven copies of the abstracts, which are requested in order to expedite review by the Committee, should be sent as soon as possible, but not later than March 1.

Regulations for Submission of Abstracts

1. An Active Member may submit no more than two abstracts, one as author, and one as co-author. He may, in lieu of submitting abstracts, introduce no more than two abstracts on behalf of nonmembers. When submitting one abstract he may introduce one abstract by a nonmember.

2. While utilizing his prerogative with respect to a total of two abstracts, the name of the Member may appear once again as co-author, providing that the abstract was submitted by another Member. He may not, however, have another abstract of his own introduced by another Member.

3. Abstracts of nonmembers must be introduced by Active Members in accordance with #1 (see above) and are limited to one for a nonmember.

4. Abstracts are limited to 300 words. Those exceeding 300 words will not be accepted. The number of words contained in the abstract (excluding the title and authors) should appear at the end of the abstract.

5. Abstracts must be double spaced and seven copies must be submitted.

6. The headings of abstracts should be in the following form:

- a. Title(s), first letters of major words being capitalized.
- b. Author(s) name(s), no degrees (e.g., M.D.), or academic titles should be included.
- c. Active Members serving as authors or co-authors should be indicated by an asterisk.
- d. City and State of origin of work.

7. Abstracts accepted will be printed as submitted to the Chairman of the Committee on Scientific Programs. They should be carefully written and edited prior to submission. Changes may not be made after they have been submitted.

8. Abstracts must be postmarked not later than March 1, 1965.

9. Abstracts should not contain acknowledgments, diagrams, charts, tables or references. Charts or tables may be sent to aid the Committee in selecting abstracts for the program, but reference to charts, tables, etc., should not be made in the text since they will not appear in the published abstracts.

10. Papers are to be presented by the first author listed. Presentation at the Annual Meeting will be strictly limited to fifteen minutes to allow time for discussion.

1965 RESEARCH AND ESSAY CONTESTS

Members of the American Diabetes Association and subscribers to DIABETES are asked to encourage medical students and physicians within five years after completion of medical school and bioscientists who are predoctoral or not more than two years postdoctoral to enter the 1965 Research and Essay Contests sponsored by the Association. Prizes to be awarded are as follows:

RESEARCH CONTEST: \$500 prize for the best paper reporting original work, whether laboratory investigation or clinical observation.

ESSAY CONTEST: \$250 prize for the best review article or case report.

The prize winners as well as those receiving Honorable Mention are also given a one-year subscription to DIABETES: *The Journal of the American Diabetes Association*.

The papers will be judged on the basis of value of the material and manner of presentation. Any subject relating to diabetes and basic metabolic problems may be selected.

Papers entered in the Contests should not have been published previously. Appropriate manuscripts will be considered for publication in DIABETES.

The deadline for receipt of entries is April 15, 1965.

Manuscripts should be submitted in triplicate (original and two copies), typewritten and double spaced. A letter of transmittal should accompany the manuscript specifying the Contest being entered, and addressed to: Committee on Scientific Awards, American Diabetes Association, Inc., 18 East 48th Street, New York, New York 10017.

McDonald, M.D., Chief, Diabetes and Arthritis Program, Division of Chronic Diseases, United States Public Health Service.

PERSONALS

JEROME W. CONN, M.D., Ann Arbor, a past President of the American Diabetes Association, will be the recipient of the 1965 John Phillips Memorial Award of the American College of Physicians for his distinguished contributions in internal medicine. The award will be presented to Dr. Conn at Convocation ceremonies on Thursday, March 25, during the Golden Anniversary meeting of the College in Chicago, March 22-26. Dr. Conn will be the twenty-ninth recipient of the Award. Among previous John Phillips Memorial Medalists is Dr. Charles H. Best, codiscoverer of insulin.

In connection with the Award, Dr. Conn will present a special lecture during the First Plenary Session of The American College of Physicians meeting on Monday, March 22. He will speak on "Normal and Altered Function of the Renin-Angiotensin-Aldosterone System in Man."
