TWENTY-FIFTH ANNUAL MEETING WILL BE HELD JUNE 19-20

The Silver Anniversary Meeting of the American Diabetes Association will be held at the Hotel Roosevelt in New York City on Saturday and Sunday, June 19-20, immediately prior to the annual session of the American Medical Association, June 20-24.

Pertinent information concerning the Meeting, including details about hotel reservations, was published in the March issue of this Journal. Members of the Association who plan to attend the Meeting and desire to stay at the Hotel Roosevelt should complete the reservation card already mailed to them, and send it directly to the hotel as soon as possible. In the event that there is a shortage of rooms, assignment will be made in the order in which reservations are received.

SCIENTIFIC PROGRAM

A total of thirty-four papers and the Banting Memorial Lecture will be presented during the Scientific Sessions, which will be held on Saturday, June 19, and Sunday, June 20. A panel on hypoglycemia, beginning at 3:45 p.m. on June 19, and moderated by Stefan S. Fajans, M.D., Ann Arbor, will close the Saturday afternoon session. Marvin Cornblath, M.D., Chicago, Norbert Freinkel, M.D., Boston, and Rosalyn S. Yalow, Ph.D., New York, will be members of the panel.

title, and other information about the Meeting, will be published in this Journal. The Program, as a separate publication, including abstracts of all papers, will be sent in advance to the Members. In addition, the abstracts will be published in the issue of DIABETES immediately following the Meeting.

DIABETES-RELATED LITERATURE INDEX FOR THE YEAR 1962

STONE, M.D., all of Iowa City, will take part in "Basic Principles in Internal Medicine," Postgraduate Course No. 16 of the American College of Physicians. The Course will be presented June 7-11 at the University of Iowa in Iowa City.

The session on endocrinology and diabetes includes papers on "Hirsutism" (Dr. Brown); "Metabolism of Adipose Tissue" (Dr. Stone); "Clinical Disorders of Antidiuretic Hormone Secretion" (Dr. Dingman); and a panel discussion on "The Treatment of Diabetes Mellitus and Its Complications" (Drs. Hardin, Stone, and Brown).

Dr. Connor, who is Associate Director of the Course, will also present "Methods for Reducing the Serum Lipids," in a session on cardiovascular-renal diseases.
