AFFILIATE ASSOCIATIONS**

The NEW YORK DIABETES ASSOCIATION (Clinical Society) will sponsor its 13th Annual Symposium on Saturday, Oct. 16, 1965, at the Barbizon-Plaza Hotel, in New York City. The Symposium Committee is headed by Edward Tolstoi, M.D., who is also Chairman of the Clinical Society.

The Symposium, entitled "Diabetes 1965," will begin at 9:30 a.m. with a paper by T. S. Danowski, M.D., President of the American Diabetes Association and Professor of Medicine, University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine, on "Clinical and Practical Aspects." He will be followed by David M. Kipnis, M.D., Professor of Medicine, Washington University School of Medicine, whose topic will be "Hormonal Bio-Chemical Phases"; and Rachmiel Levine, M.D., Professor and Chairman, Department of Medicine, New York Medical College, who will speak on "Diabetes—A Cautious Look into the Future."

Following a luncheon at 12:30, the program will be renewed at 2:30 p.m. with the presentation of the following papers: "Pregnancy and Diabetes," by William H. Daughaday, M.D., Professor of Medicine, Washington University School

of Medicine; "The Infant of the Diabetic Mother," by Marvin Cornblath, M.D., Professor of Pediatrics, University of Illinois College of Medicine; and "The Glucoregulatory Peptide Hormones in Health and Disease," by Roger H. Unger, M.D., Associate Professor of Internal Medicine, University of Texas Southwestern Medical School.

Attendance is open to physicians, medical students and other professional personnel interested in diabetes. The registration fee is \$5.00, and advance reservations are required. There is no fee for current members of the Clinical Society and for duly certified medical students, interns, residents and fellows. The luncheon fee, including gratuities, is \$6.00.
