INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF INTERNAL MEDICINE

The Ninth International Congress of Internal Medicine of the International Society of Internal Medicine will be held in Amsterdam September 7-10, 1966. "Integration in Internal Medicine" is the principal theme. Secondary themes include auto-immune diseases and transplantation; use of corticosteroids in internal medicine; radioisotopes in diagnosis and treatment; and recent developments in internal medicine. Since 1960 the Hope, a 15,000 ton former Navy hospital ship, has visited Indonesia, South Vietnam, Peru, Ecuador and Guinea.
