SIXTH CONGRESS OF THE INTERNATIONAL DIABETES FEDERATION

The International Diabetes Federation will hold its Sixth Congress in Stockholm, Sweden, July 30-August 4, 1967. The Congress is open to physicians as well as laymen. A general program for the latter will parallel the scientific program. Registration, opening ceremony, and reception will take place on Sunday, July 30, in the afternoon. The scientific sessions will begin on Monday, July 31, and will continue through Friday, August 4, in Folkets Hus (Congress Hall). ASIA CONGRESS OF ENDOCRINOLOGY
