THE DECEMBER MEETING AT CAMBRIDGE

The annual meeting of the Society will be held Wednesday and Thursday, December 27 and 28, 1933 at Cambridge, Mass., at Harvard University, Harvard Hall, Rm. 5. Hotel Headquarters will be Hotel Victoria, Boston.

Preliminary results from the International Polar and Cloud Year observations, Aug., 1932-Aug., 1933, will be featured, especially the aerological, cloud and solar data from Mt. Washington and Blue Hill (Harvard University) and the airplane observations from East Boston (Mass. Inst. of Technology). President Kimball will address the Society on atmospheric turbidity in various types of air

masses in eastern North America. Visits will be made to the meteorological laboratories of Mass. Inst. of Technology and Harvard in Cambridge, to the Blue Hill Meteorological Observatory, of Harvard University, in Milton, to the new U. S. Weather Bureau Office in Boston, and to the airport station of the Weather Bureau and the meteorological airplane of the Mass. Inst. of Technology at East Boston.

Titles and abstracts of papers to be offered at this meeting should be sent to the Secretary at once.
