Cooperation of Weather Bureau with Private Consultants

The brief account given in the January, 1941, BULLETIN, page 31, of the discussion relative to the private practice of meteorology should not be taken as a review of the paper on "Technical Progress and the Professional Consultant in Meteorology". The paper will be published in full in a later issue. The work of the consultant in meteorology is a service supplemental to that of the Weather Bureau and is recognized as an increasingly important field. The private consultant who engages in specialized forecasting for individual needs can contribute much in weather service to private interests. The Weather Bureau is interested in this development and desires to cooperate fully with the private meteorologist.
