

election results

Announcement of the newly chosen president-elect and councilors of the American Meteorological Society was made at the 51st annual business meeting held on 13 January in San Francisco, Calif.

Incoming as president for 1971 is Prof. Alfred K. Blackadar, chairman of the Department of Meteorology, The Pennsylvania State University, University Park. Prof. Richard J. Reed of the Department of Atmospheric Sciences, University of Washington, Seattle, is president-elect for 1971.

Five councilors are elected to three-year terms of office each year—four by the Society's members and one by the Council. Elected to the Council by the members of the Society were Prof. Charles L. Hosler, dean of the College of

Earth and Mineral Sciences, The Pennsylvania State University, University Park; Capt. William J. Kotsch, commander of the Naval Weather Service, Washington, D. C.; Dr. Paul B. MacCready, Jr., consulting meteorologist, Altadena, Calif.; and Silvio G. Simplicio, director of the Eastern Region of the National Weather Service, Garden City, N. Y. Elected by the Council was Prof. Warren S. Wooster, Scripps Institution of Oceanography, La Jolla, Calif. The term of office for all will run from 1971 through 1973.
