**Matthew Toyli**  
1914–1974

We at AMS headquarters were greatly saddened by the recent death on March 31, 1974, of Matthew Toyli, AMS staff member for thirteen years. Prior to his work at 45 Beacon Street, Mr. Toyli served in the Air Weather Service in Europe, Greenland, and the United States, including several tours at Headquarters, Air Weather Service.

It would be impossible to describe Matt's job at AMS headquarters, for he was involved in many phases of Society activities. He was well known by many members for his genial and accommodating manner at meetings and conferences. These traits were always in evidence to headquarters callers and visitors. Matt will be greatly missed by his numerous friends.

He is survived by his wife, Annchen (Mueller), who plans to return to her native Germany where she and Matt first met.

In the beginning of February Executive Director Spengler was attending the Society's first conference in Africa, the International Tropical Meteorology Meeting with the World Meteorological Organization and East African Meteorological Department, in Nairobi, Kenya.

Mr. Spengler returned to Boston through Zurich, where on 8 February he had discussions with Dr. Schneider, director of the Swiss Institute of Meteorology, and Dr. Primault, also of the Institute and vice-president of the Swiss Meteorological Society, about the possibilities of future joint meetings of the two societies. Executive Director Spengler also went to Geneva on the 8th for a visit with Secretary-General D. A. Davies and Deputy Secretary-General, K. Langlo of the World Meteorological Organization, for discussions concern-

ing mutual interests of the WMO and AMS.

On 19 February the Admissions Board met at AMS Headquarters. Attending were: Chairman Peter R. Leavitt, Robert C. Curtis, Robert E. Lautzenheiser, and new member Thomas Keegan of Air Force Cambridge Research Laboratories.

Mr. Spengler went to Washington, D.C., on 21 February for Air Force briefings at the midwinter conference of the Reserve Officers Association, and to attend a luncheon for the Secretary of the Air Force, Dr. McLucas.

On 26 February Executive Director Spengler attended the opening session and evening reception of the Third Climatic Impact Assessment Program in Cambridge, Mass. Also on the 26th, the Executive Director met with Dr. A. F. Spilhaus, Jr., Executive Director of the American Geophysical Union, for lengthy discussions of mutual society activities.

On 27 February Mr. Spengler went to San Francisco to attend the Annual Meeting of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, in which the AMS participated.
