14–16 April 1982: The National Bureau of Standards (NBS) will host a National Science Foundation/NBS-sponsored workshop on Wind Tunnel Modeling Criteria and Techniques in Wind Engineering Applications, 14–16 April 1982 at NBS' Gaithersburg, Md., headquarters. Workshop co-sponsors are the American Society of Civil Engineering's aerodynamics and wind effects committees and the Wind Engineering Research Council, Inc.
