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## Response

We are glad that Dr. Telford has written to express his viewpoint, and we think it is important that the research community carry on a spectrum of approaches in stratocumulus cloud modeling. Our paper was not intended to be a comprehensive review of stratocumulus research; in fact, the papers we cited span a very wide variety of other subjects, including, for example, satellite cloud retrieval techniques and Doppler radar technology. The stratocumulus papers cited represent only a small and admittedly biased sample of the diverse literature on the subject.
