- Alexander Marble, M.D., of Boston, will present the Banting Memorial Lecture on Saturday, June 17, and will receive the Banting Memorial Award. Dr. Marble, a Past President of the American Diabetes Association, is Clinical Professor of Medicine, Harvard Medical School; Physician, Joslin Clinic and New England Deaconess Hospital; Senior Associate in Medicine, Peter Bent Brigham Hospital, Boston.

INTERNATIONAL DIABETES FEDERATION
SIXTH CONGRESS JULY 30 - AUGUST 4

As previously announced, the Sixth Congress of the International Diabetes Federation will be held in Stockholm, Sweden, July 30 - August 4. While the American Diabetes Association cannot undertake travel arrangements for its Members, such arrangements may be made through Garber Travel, 1406 Beacon Street, Brookline, Massachusetts. The Congress is open to laymen as well as physicians. A general program for the former will be held concurrently with the scientific program. Registration, opening ceremony, and reception will take place on Sunday, July 30. The Scientific Sessions will begin on Monday, July 31, and will continue through Friday, August 4, in Folkets Hus (Congress Hall). Official languages will be English, French and German. Simultaneous interpretation will be arranged at all Panel Discussions, Lectures and other papers.
