**NEW MEAL PLANNING PUBLICATIONS**

"Adaptations of Food Exchange Lists for ADA Fat-Controlled Diabetic Diets" and "Diabetic Diet Card for Physicians and Dietitians for Use with Fat-Controlled Diets" have been recently published by The American Dietetic Association in collaboration with the American Diabetes Association and the National Center for Chronic Disease Control of the Public Health Service. The new material may be obtained through the offices of the American Diabetes Association, 18 East 48th Street, New York, N.Y. 10017, at the same price as the other individual meal plans and the "Diabetic Diet Card for Physicians": \$.05 per single copy; \$2.00 per 100 copies; \$18.00 per 1,000 copies.

Previously published meal plans also available are Meal Plans No. 1 through No. 9: (1) 1200, (2) 1500, (3) 1800, (4) 2200, (5) 1800 (includes more milk than No. 3), (6) 2600, (7) 3500, (8) 2600 (includes less milk than No. 6), and (9) 5000 calories respectively. Meal Plans 5, 6 and 7 are especially suitable for children since they contain more milk than the others. "ADA Bland Low-fiber Diabetic Diet"; and "ADA Sodium Restricted Diabetic Diet" are also available. They and the Meal Plans are to be used in conjunction with the Meal Planning Booklet.

The twenty-four page booklet, *Meal Planning with Exchange Lists*, was prepared to help diabetics select foods for their meals. It is available at \$.15 each; \$6.50 per 100 copies and \$50.00 per 1,000 copies.

## PERSONALS

JEROME W. CONN, M.D., a past President of the American Diabetes Association, and present Chairman of the Association's Committee on Research, has been named Louis Harry Newburgh University Professor of Internal Medicine at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor. Dr. Conn will hold this title throughout his teaching life as recognition for his outstanding achievements in metabolism and endocrinology.

JOHN C. BECK, M.D., Montreal, and JEROME W. CONN, M.D., Ann Arbor, will take part in "Hypertensive Cardiovascular Diseases: Mechanisms and Treatment," a postgraduate course of The American College of Physicians to be held February 28-29 and March 1-2, at the Clinical Research Institute of Montreal. Dr. Beck is Co-Director of the Course, and will present "Hormonal Hypertension," and take part in panel discussions on "The Relationship of the Adrenal Glands to Hypertensive Diseases," "The Relationship of Sodium and of the Sympathetic Nervous System to Hypertensive Diseases," and "Treatment of Hypertension." Dr. Conn will present "Primary Aldosteronism" and take part in a panel discussion of "The Relationship of the Adrenal Glands to Hypertensive Diseases."

GLEN W. McDONALD, M.D., Chief of the Diabetes and Arthritis Control Program of the United States Public Health Service, has been awarded a special Commendation Medal by the Surgeon General for his "accomplishments in the improvement of understanding and control of diabetes and arthritis in the United States and throughout the world."

Dr. McDonald, who assumed responsibility for all Public Health Service diabetes activities in June 1960, entered the Public Health Service in June 1956 as Chief of the Health Division, International Cooperation Administration, first in Iran, and later in Haiti.
