JEROME W. CONN, M.D., a past President of the American Diabetes Association, and present Chairman of the Association's Committee on Research, has been named Louis Harry Newburgh University Professor of Internal Medicine at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor. Dr. Conn will hold this title throughout his teaching life as recognition for his outstanding achievements in metabolism and endocrinology.

JOHN C. BECK, M.D., Montreal, and JEROME W. CONN, M.D., Ann Arbor, will take part in "Hypertensive Cardiovascular Diseases: Mechanisms and Treatment," a postgraduate course of The American College of Physicians to be held February 28-29 and March 1-2, at the Clinical Research Institute of Montreal.
