TWENTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL MEETING WILL BE HELD JUNE 15-16

The American Diabetes Association will hold its Twenty-eighth Annual Meeting at the Sheraton-Palace Hotel in San Francisco on June 15-16, immediately prior to the Annual Convention of the American Medical Association, June 16-20. Pertinent information about the Meeting, together with a hotel reservation card, was mailed to all Members of the Association in January.

REGISTRATION

The Scientific Sessions are open to members of the medical and allied professions. There is no registration fee for Members of the Association or The Endocrine Society. The registration fee for all others is \$5.00, which includes a copy of the supplement to this Journal containing the printed Program. Admission is by badge only and everyone is requested to register. The Program will be distributed in May.

SCIENTIFIC SESSIONS

Saturday, June 15, and Sunday, June 16, are the dates for the Scientific Sessions.

Forty-four papers will be presented. They were selected from Abstracts submitted for consideration by the Committee on Scientific Programs, surpassing the previous high of 114 submitted for the 1966 Meeting. One hundred and four papers will be included in the Program By Title and Abstract.

Saturday morning, June 15: Two concurrent sessions, one

Sunday morning, June 16: Two concurrent sessions, one clinical and one basic research, until 11:00 a.m. One combined session immediately follows.

Sunday afternoon, June 16: One combined session.
