The American Dietetic Association will hold its Fifty-first Annual Meeting in San Francisco October 15-18. The San Francisco Hilton will be the headquarters hotel, and the sessions and exhibition will be held in the Civic Auditorium—Brooks Hall.

PERSONALS

FRANK N. ALLAN, M.D., Boston, a past President of the American Diabetes Association and first Editor of this Journal, attended the annual meeting of the Indian Medical Association Dec. 28-30, 1967, in Jabalpur, Central India, as official delegate of the American Medical Association. He presented two papers entitled "Current Concepts Regarding Diabetes," and "Governmental Regulation of Drugs." Dr. Allan, former Chairman of the Medical Department of the Lahey Clinic Foundation, is a member of the staff of the United States Food and Drug Administration, and commutes weekly between Boston and Washington, D.C.

RAFAEL A. CAMERINI-DAVALOS, M.D., D.SC., New York, Director of the Diabetes Center of Flower and Fifth Avenue Hospitals and Metropolitan Hospital, delivered a series of lectures in South America in March, and will also lecture there during April.

ALBERT E. RENOLD, M.D., of the Department of Clinical Biochemistry, University of Geneva, Switzerland, lectured on "Experimental and Spontaneous Diabetes in Animals: Useful Models of Diabetes in Man?" on April 2 at the Diabetes Center of the New York Medical College. On May 14, W. P. U. JACKSON, M.D., of the University of Cape Town Medical School in South Africa, will speak on "Aging in Diabetes" at the same institution. These lectures are part of the "Diabetes Today" series of seminars which are open to all physicians, students, and members of the public. They are given from 4:30 to 6:00 p.m. in Room 113 of the Cohen-Research Building, Madison Avenue and 106th Street, New York, N.Y.

ALBERT WINEGRAD, M.D., Philadelphia, will be a member of the faculty of "The Prevention and Early Detection of Disease in Clinical Practice," a postgraduate course of The American College of Physicians to be held at the College of Physicians of Philadelphia May 20-24. Dr. Winegrad will present "Carbohydrate Metabolism, Diabetes and Hyperlipidemia" in the afternoon session of May 20.
