Announcement: The name of the winner will be announced in *DIABETES*. The winner will be invited to present a paper on his work at the Annual Meeting. Papers considered for the award must be submitted with the idea that they will be published in whole or in part in *DIABETES* if found acceptable to the Editor and/or Editorial Board. If the Committee should decide that no outstanding work has been presented for this consideration, the award will not be made.

Award: In addition to the monetary award and medal, traveling expenses will be given to make it possible for the recipient to receive his award in person at the Annual Meeting.

INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF HYGIENE AND PREVENTIVE MEDICINE

The Fifth International Congress of Hygiene and Preventive Medicine will be held in Rome October 8-12, sponsored by the International Federation of Hygiene and Preventive Medicine, organized by the Italian Association for Hygiene and Public Health, and under the patronage of the President of the Italian Republic.

On October 9, in a session entitled "Prevention and Early Diagnosis of Inherited and Metabolic Diseases," H. Hellauer, Bad Hall, Austria, will present "Experimental Data on the Problem of Using Cyclamate as a Sweetening Agent." E. Studer, M. Cikes, and L. K. Widmer, of Basel, will discuss "Age Dependence of Glucose Tolerance and Its Significance for Diagnosis of Diabetes Mellitus. Observations on 1,060 Men during the Basel Study II."

A session on "Prevention of Inherited and Metabolic Diseases" will be held on October 11, at which the following papers will be presented: "Prediabetes," Prof. R. Liberti, Dr. C. A. Cicconetti, D. Di Virgilio, C. Teodonio, all of Rome; "On the Prediabetic State," Prof. G. R. Constam, Zurich; "The Prophylaxis of Diabetes," Profs. I. Pavel and R. Pieptea, Bucharest; "Medical-Social Problems of Diabetes," Prof. M. Derot, and Dr. R. Lebouc, Paris; and "Some Aspects of the Prevention of Diabetes," Prof. L. Travia, Rome.

CONFERENCE ON NUTRITION AND METABOLISM

The Committee on Nutrition and Metabolism of the Philadelphia County Medical Society will hold its Thirteenth Annual Conference on October 23 in the auditorium of Temple University Medical Center. Professor John Yudkin, Queen Elizabeth College, University of London, will speak on "The Role of Nutrition in Cardiovascular Disease."

The afternoon session will be devoted to four workshops on nutritional and metabolic aspects of (1) renal disease, (2) diabetes mellitus, (3) preventive cardiovascular disease, and (4) malabsorption syndrome. Speakers for the workshops will be drawn from the faculties of the local medical schools.
