### JUNE 28-29 IS THE DATE FOR TWENTY-NINTH ANNUAL MEETING

The Twenty-ninth Annual Meeting of the American Diabetes Association will be held at The Hotel Roosevelt in New York City June 28-29. Pertinent information about the meeting, together with a hotel reservation card, was mailed to all Members of the Association on December 30.

#### REGISTRATION

The Scientific Sessions are open to members of the medical and allied professions. There is no registration fee for Members of the Association, and an advance registration form will be sent to them in May. The registration fee for all others except members of The Endocrine Society is \$5.00, which includes the Program to be issued as a supplement to this Journal. Admission is by badge only.

#### THE ENDOCRINE SOCIETY

The Fifty-first Annual Meeting of The Endocrine Society will be held June 27, 28 and 29 at The Americana Hotel in New York City. There will be advance registration June 26, 2:00 p.m.-10 p.m., in the Malmeson Suite, and during the meeting in the Georgian Ballroom Foyer, 8:00 a.m.-5 p.m. Of particular interest to Members of the American Diabetes Association is a session on Friday morning entitled "Pancreas,

Growth Hormone and Intermediate Metabolism" and a symposium on Friday afternoon, "Recent Advances in Hepatic Lipid Metabolism." The Symposium titles and speakers will be published in the Association program.

Arrangements have been made so members of The Endocrine Society may attend the Scientific Sessions of the American Diabetes Association and Association members may attend, without charge, the sessions of The Society. Members of The Society are requested to register and may obtain copies of the Association program at \$1.00 each. Members of the American Diabetes Association are requested to present their membership cards at The Society's Registration Desk.

#### SCIENTIFIC SESSIONS

acterization of the Diabetic State," and "Insulin Effects and Intermediary Metabolism."

*Sunday afternoon, June 29:* One combined Session on "Proinsulin."

MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

- Earl W. Sutherland, M.D., Professor of Physiology, Vanderbilt University School of Medicine, Nashville, Tennessee, will deliver the Banting Memorial Lecture at the close of the Scientific Session on Saturday morning, June 28, and will receive the Banting Medal. The Lectureship is the highest honor the Association confers and is made for outstanding contributions in the field of diabetes and related carbohydrate metabolism.
- A Banting Medal will also be awarded to Robert W. Jack-

son, M.D., Professor and Chairman, Department of Pediatrics, University of Missouri School of Medicine, Columbia, Missouri, for his distinguished study of the natural history of juvenile diabetes and his success in establishing diabetes as an important entity in pediatrics.

- Donald F. Steiner, M.D., Professor of Biochemistry at the University of Chicago, will receive the 1969 Lilly Award for his contributions to the knowledge of the physiology of the beta cell leading to the discovery of proinsulin and its characterization.
- The Annual Banquet and Social Hour are scheduled for Saturday evening, June 28. Members, their families and friends are cordially invited to attend. A Banquet reservation form will be mailed to all Members in advance of the Meeting.

## PARAMEDICAL POSTGRADUATE COURSE APRIL 28-30

The American Diabetes Association will hold its First Paramedical Postgraduate Course in Diabetes April 28-30 in Boston. Planned by Drs. Alexander Marble, Director, and Leo P. Krall, Co-Director, both of Boston, the Course was developed in cooperation with the Joslin Diabetes Foundation under the auspices of the Association's Committee on Professional Education, chaired by Dr. Stefan S. Fajans of Ann Arbor.

The Course is directed in particular to nurses, nutritionists, dietitians and medical technologists, in recognition of the need to convey the most current knowledge and teaching technics to members of the health team who are concerned with instruction of diabetic patients and their families.

The complete program for the Course, together with other pertinent information, was published in the March issue of this Journal. Also, the program was sent to all Members in March.
