Buenos Aires, Argentina, will be the site of the Seventh Congress of the International Diabetes Federation to be held Aug. 23-28, 1970. The Congress will be a special tribute to Professor Bernardo A. Houssay, who received the Nobel Prize for his important work in the field of experimental diabetes. Virgilio G. Foglia, M.D., is President of the Seventh Congress Executive Committee and Ramon A. Chieri, M.D., is Secretary.
