ABRIDGED INDEX MEDICUS AVAILABLE

The first issue of a new monthly medical bibliography published by the National Library of Medicine appeared in January. Entitled *Abridged Index Medicus*, it is designed for the individual practitioner, and for the libraries of small

hospitals and clinics. The volume provides an index to articles in one hundred English-language journals, representing one month's input into the National Library of Medicine's computer-based MEDLARS (Medical Literature Analysis and Retrieval System). This new monthly bibliography is sold by the Superintendent of Documents, U. S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402 at the annual subscription rate of \$12.00 or \$1.00 per individual issue.
