NEWS OF AFFILIATE ASSOCIATIONS

The DIABETES ASSOCIATION OF THE CINCINNATI AREA and The University of Cincinnati Medical Center will present The Fifth Postgraduate Symposium in Diabetes on Thursday, April 16. The Symposium will be held from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at The Carrousel Inn in Cincinnati. Kenneth Kreines, M.D., Cincinnati, will be Chairman of the morning scientific session entitled "The Chronic Syndrome of Diabetes Mellitus," during which Robert E. Tranquada, M.D., Los Angeles, will present "Pathogenesis, Differential Diagnosis and Management of the Diabetic Neuropathies," and Edwin L. Bierman, M.D., Seattle, "The Role of Dietary Factors and Serum Lipids in the Development of Atherosclerosis in Diabetes." The morning session will close with the William H. Muhlberg Memorial Lecture, by T. Russell Fraser, M.D., F.R.C.P., of London, England, who will speak on "The Diabetic Retinopathy Problem." He will be introduced by Harvey C. Knowles, Jr., M.D., Cincinnati, a member of the faculty.

Paul D. Sweeney, M. D., Cincinnati, will be Chairman of the afternoon scientific session entitled "The Acute Syndrome of Diabetes Mellitus." During this session the following papers will be presented: "The Office Management of Diabetes," by Dr. Bierman; "Management of the Problem Patient with Brittle Diabetes or Insulin Resistance," by Dr. Fraser; and "The Differential Diagnosis and Treatment of Coma in Diabetes," by Dr. Tranquada. The program is acceptable for seven hours of study credit by The American Academy of General Practice.

TEACHING SEMINAR ON CARDIOVASCULAR EPIDEMIOLOGY

The Third Ten-day International Teaching Seminar on Cardiovascular Epidemiology, sponsored by The Council on Epidemiology and Prevention of the International Society of Cardiology, will be held August 23-September 4 in the British Isles. Twenty-five student Fellows can be accommodated. Nominees should be at the postdoctoral level, with some residency training or its equivalent, planning an academic or research career, and interested in cardiovascular epidemiology. Limited funds may be available to pay for room and board during the Seminar, and for transportation in an amount to \$200.00 for each accepted Fellow.
