Groundbreaking ceremonies for the Diabetes Research and Education Hospital, a \$3,000,000 structure to be located at the Medical Center of the University of Alabama in Birmingham, were held July 1. Announcement of the groundbreaking was made by Buris R. Boshell, M.D., Hanson Professor of Medicine in Diabetes and Metabolic Diseases at the University of Alabama School of Medicine.
