## THIRTY-FIRST ANNUAL MEETING JUNE 22-23 IN SAN FRANCISCO

The Sheraton-Palace Hotel in San Francisco will be the site of the Scientific Sessions of the Thirty-first Annual Meeting of the American Diabetes Association, June 22-23, and will initiate the Insulin 50th Anniversary Year—1971-1972. The Central Council will meet Sunday, June 20, and the Board of Directors Monday, June 21.

#### REGISTRATION

The Scientific Sessions are open to members of the medical and allied professions. There is no registration fee for Members of the Association or The Endocrine Society. The registration fee for all others is \$10.00 which includes a copy of the Printed Program. Everyone is required to register and admission is by badge only.

#### THE ENDOCRINE SOCIETY

The Fifty-third Annual Meeting of The Endocrine Society will be held June 24, 25 and 26 at the San Francisco Hilton. Members of the American Diabetes Association may attend,

without charge, the sessions of The Society; however, Association Members are requested to present their membership cards and register at The Society's desk.

#### SCIENTIFIC SESSIONS

Sixty-two papers will be presented in ten Scientific Sessions as follows: Tuesday, June 22 (two concurrent in the morning with a single session at 11:15 a.m., and two concurrent in the afternoon); Wednesday, June 23 (two concurrent in the morning, two concurrent in the afternoon and a single session at 7:30 p.m.).

A symposium will be held Wednesday evening on the University Group Diabetes Program Study Report. Speakers will be Thaddeus E. Prout, M.D., Baltimore, Associate Professor of Medicine, Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and Chief of Medicine, Greater Baltimore Medical Center; and Robert F. Bradley, M.D., Boston, Medical Director, Joslin Clinic, Assistant Clinical Professor of Medicine, Harvard University Medical School, and Senior Associate in Medicine, Peter Bent Brigham Hospital. Discussion and Interrogation by an Interdisciplinary Panel will follow, the panel including: *Cardiologist*: Eugene Braunwald, M.D., La Jolla, California,

Professor and Chairman, Department of Medicine, University of California, San Diego School of Medicine; *Pharmacologist*: Louis Lasagna, M.D., Rochester, New York, Professor and Chairman, Department of Pharmacology and Toxicology, and Professor of Medicine, University of Rochester Medical Center; *Epidemiologist*: Jeremiah Stamler, M.D., Chicago, Executive Director, Chicago Health Research Foundation, and Associate Professor, Department of Medicine, Northwestern University Medical School. Dr. Lasagna will also chair the Symposium.

Abstracts of papers to be presented, those by title, and pertinent information will be published in the Program. It will be distributed without charge to Members of the Association and to subscribers to this Journal. Single copies are \$2.00 each to all others.

#### MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

- George F. Cahill, Jr., M.D., Boston, Professor of Medicine and Director, Elliott P. Joslin Research Laboratory, Harvard Medical School, will deliver the Banting Memorial Lecture at the close of the Scientific Sessions on Tuesday morning, June 22, and will receive a Banting Medal. The Lectureship is the highest honor the Association confers and is made for outstanding contributions in the field of diabetes and related carbohydrate metabolism. Dr. Cahill will speak on "Physiology of Insulin in Man."
- William R. Kirtley, M.D., Indianapolis, will receive a Banting Medal for his many years of devoted service as Abstracts Editor of this Journal and as Treasurer of the Association. Dr. Kirtley is Assistant Professor of Medicine, Indiana University School of Medicine, and Director, Medical Research Division, The Lilly Research Laboratories.
- Daniel Porte, Jr., M.D., Seattle, will receive the 1971 Lilly Award for his pioneer work in studying the relationship between catecholamines and insulin secretion in humans, and for his contributions in the fields of lipid and carbohydrate metabolism. Dr. Porte is Chief, Endocrinology Section, and Associate Professor of Medicine, University of Washington School of Medicine.
