**NINETEENTH POSTGRADUATE COURSE**

"Diabetes in Review: Clinical Conference 1972," the Nineteenth Postgraduate Course of the American Diabetes Association, will be held at the Sheraton-Four Ambassadors in Miami, Florida, Monday through Wednesday, January 24, 25 and 26. The program will be published in DIABETES and will be mailed separately in the fall to all Members as well as most internists, general practitioners and other interested physicians throughout the country.

The lectures will be divided into three categories focusing on metabolism, diagnosis and therapy, and complications. From 3:30 to 5:00 on each of the three afternoons of the Course there will be ten simultaneous Workshops entitled as follows: "Comas in Diabetes," "Hypoglycemias," "Diabetes in Children and Unstable Diabetes," "Therapy of Adult-type Diabetes Including Use of Oral Hypoglycemic Agents," "Diabetic Nephropathy," "Diabetic Neuropathy," "Diabetic Retinopathy," "Ischemic Disease of the Extremities," "Criteria for Diagnosis of Diabetes," and "Dietary Management."

Daniel H. Mintz, M.D., Miami, is Director of the Course which is an activity of the Committee on Professional Education of which Karl E. Sussman, M.D., Denver, is Chairman. Fee is \$100 for Members of the Association and \$125 for non-members.

**SIXTEENTH ANNUAL LILLY AWARD**

The 1972 Lilly Award will be given at the Thirty-second Annual Meeting of the American Diabetes Association. The following stipulations govern the contest for this annual award, which is supported by Eli Lilly and Company and consists of \$1,000 and a medal.

*Purpose:* To recognize demonstrated research in the field of diabetes, taking into consideration independence of thought and originality.

*Eligibility:* Any investigator in an appropriate field of work, closely related to diabetes, who is less than forty years of age on January 1 of the year in which the award is made. The research will not necessarily be judged in comparison to the work of more mature and experienced workers. The candidate should be a resident of the United States or Canada.

*Nominations:* Nominations for the award will be solicited from the Members of the American Diabetes Association. Such nominations will be requested by repeated notices to be published in DIABETES. Names of nominees must be received before December 1 of the year preceding the award. The nomination should be accompanied by full information concerning the nominee's personality, training and research work. Eleven copies of each item should be submitted. No Member may send in more than one nomination. A list of the nominee's publications, if any, and eleven copies of the publication or manuscript for which the award is to be given should also

accompany the nomination. The award may be given for work published during the year prior to December 1 of the year preceding the award. The nominee should be actively engaged at that time in the line of research for which the award is to be made.

*Announcement:* The name of the winner will be announced in DIABETES. The winner will be invited to present a paper on his work at the Annual Meeting. Papers considered for the award must be submitted with the idea that they will be published in whole or in part in DIABETES if found acceptable to the Editor and/or Editorial Board. If the Committee should decide that no outstanding work has been presented for this consideration, the award will not be made.

*Award:* In addition to the monetary award and medal, traveling expenses will be given to make it possible for the recipient to receive his award in person at the Annual Meeting.

**DIABETES POSTGRADUATE COURSE IN INDIANAPOLIS**

The Course will begin Thursday morning, October 21, at Myers Auditorium, Marion County General Hospital, with registration at 8:00 and Introductions by Dr. Johnston at 9:00. The morning session entitled "Milestones in the History of Insulin," will be chaired by Dr. Challoner, and the following papers will be given: "The Discovery of Insulin," Dr. Best; "The Amino Acid Sequence of Insulin," Dr. Smith; "The Synthesis of Insulin," Dr. Zahn; "The Discovery and Significance of Proinsulin," Dr. Steiner; "The Tertiary Structure of Insulin," Dr. Dodson. A Diet Workshop and Lunch will be held at 12:00. The afternoon session, entitled "Natural Course and Complications of Diabetes," will be chaired by Dr. Powell, and the following papers will be presented: "The Natural History of Diabetes," Dr. Marble; "Diabetic Microangiopathy: Its Relationship to Carbohydrate Intolerance," Dr. Williamson; "Diabetic Retinopathy," Dr. Davis; "The Polyol Pathway and Diabetic Complications," Dr. Winegrad; "Aging Mechanisms and Diabetes," Dr. Andres.

The Friday, October 22 sessions will also be held at Myers Auditorium, beginning at 9:00 a.m. "Pathogenesis of Diabetes Mellitus" is the subject of the morning session to be chaired by Dr. Clark. "Insulin Secretion" will be presented by Dr. Lacy; "Role of Glucagon in Diabetes," Dr. Unger; "Diabetes—Pancreas and Periphery," Dr. Porte; "Search for an Experimental

Model," Dr. Ashmore; "The Course of Early Diabetes—Metabolic and Hormonal Interrelationships," Dr. Soeldner. A Diet Workshop and Lunch will be held at 12:00. "Treatment Problems in Diabetes" will be the subject of the afternoon session to be chaired by Dr. Galloway. "Metabolic Coma in the Diabetic" will be presented by Dr. Clark; "Insulin—The Antigen," Dr. Chance; "Insulin Antibodies," Dr. Wright; "Insulin Resistance," Dr. Davidson, and "Insulin Allergy," Dr. Galloway.

A reception and dinner will be held at the Indianapolis Hilton Hotel beginning at 6:30 Friday evening.

The Course will conclude with a morning session on Saturday, October 23, to be held at the Lilly Center, Eli Lilly and Company. Topic of the session will be "Management of Maturity-onset Diabetes" with Dr. Vance as chairman. "Selection of Patients for Oral Therapy" will be presented by Dr. Pfeiffer; "Use of the Oral Agent," Dr. Bradley; and "The UGDP Study," Dr. Prout. The Course will adjourn at 11:45 a.m.
