The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) has announced the recall of the following products. Consumers should stop using recalled products unless otherwise instructed. ### Baby monitor batteries

**Units:** About 800,000

**Hazard:** The battery in the handheld video monitor can overheat and burst, which is a burn hazard.

**Description:** The rechargeable batteries in Summer Infant handheld color video monitors are recalled. TCL is printed on the lower right corner of the battery. Monitors are sold with a matching camera and A/C adaptors. **Sold at:** Mass merchants, including Babies "R" Us, online retailers and independent juvenile specialty stores from February 2010 through 2012 for \$150 to \$350.

**Remedy:** Remove the battery and contact Summer Infant for a replacement. The monitor can be used with the power cord.
