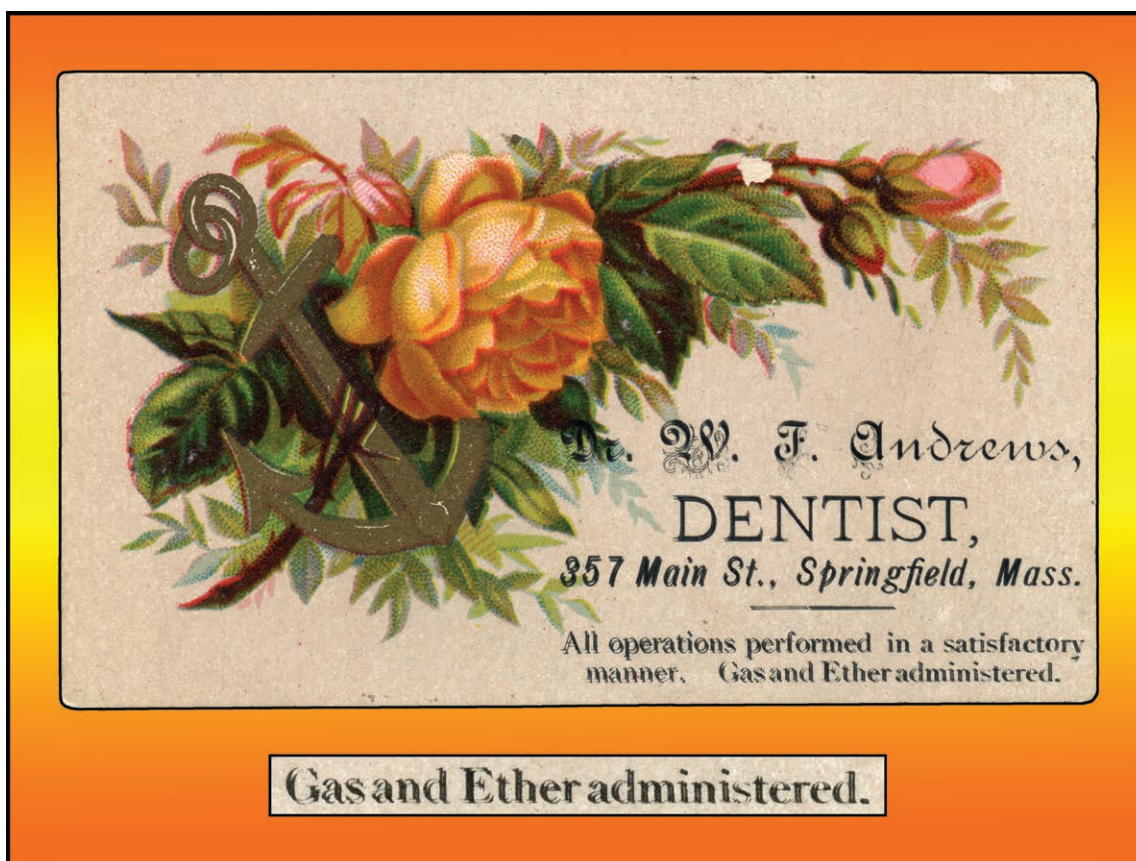


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ANESTHESIOLOGY REFLECTIONS FROM THE WOOD LIBRARY-MUSEUM

How Springfield's Dr. W. F. Andrews Dispensed Ether, Gas, and Books



A native of Portland, Maine, Dr. William Francis Andrews (1852 to 1930) earned his D.D.S. in 1876 at the Maryland Dental College (1876). After moving to Springfield, Massachusetts, he married in 1877 and joined the Masons a year later. In this Ben Z. Swanson Collection trade card from the Wood Library-Museum, Dr. Andrews advertised his prowess at administering [laughing] “Gas and Ether” anesthetics.
