"Diabetes Related to General Medicine," the third annual international postgraduate Pan-American Course, will be held October 29-November 1 at the Hotel Gloria in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. The course is offered as a joint educational effort by Harvard University Medical School, the Joslin Diabetes Foundation, the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro and the Pontifical Catholic University of Rio de Janeiro.
