FIFTH ALLIED HEALTH POSTGRADUATE COURSE

The American Diabetes Association will hold its Fifth Allied Health Postgraduate Course in Diabetes April 9-11 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, under the auspices of the Committee on

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Professional Education of the Association, chaired by Karl E. Sussman, M.D., of Denver. Director of the Course is Charles R. Shuman, M.D., of Philadelphia. Alexander Marble, M.D., Physician-in-Chief, Joslin Clinic, Boston, and G. Donald Whedon, M.D., Director, National Institute of Arthritis, Metabolism, and Digestive Diseases, Bethesda, will be guest speakers.

The Course is offered in recognition of the need to convey the most current knowledge and teaching technics to members of the health team who are concerned with instruction of diabetic patients and their families. It is directed in particular to nurses, nutritionists and dietitians.

The printed Program, which includes a registration form, will be sent in February or early March to all Members of the Association and to thousands of leaders in dietetics and nursing throughout the country. TRAVEL GRANTS AVAILABLE FOR EIGHTH IDF CONGRESS

The Committee on Research of the American Diabetes Association announces that travel grants to the Eighth Congress of the International Diabetes Federation have been made available through the National Institutes of Health. The Congress will be held in Brussels, Belgium, July 15-20. The following stipulations apply:

1. Applications should be addressed to Rachmiel Levine, M.D., Chairman, Committee on Research, American Diabetes Association, 18 East 48th Street, New York, N.Y. 10017. They will be accepted from April 1 to April 15.

2. Travel grants will be awarded to younger investigators with limited means of support.

3. Applicants should state what travel support is currently available to them through the National Institutes or other sources.

4. Grants of about \$100 will be made available to workshop participants for their living expenses in Brussels, provided they are not presenting invited papers, are not panel participants, and are not chairmen of workshops.

5. The remaining portion of the grant will be divided among American participants whose free papers have been accepted by the program committee of the Congress, excluding those listed under #4 above. The individual amounts will vary with need but will not exceed \$250.

6. The names and locations of those awarded travel grants will be published in a later issue of *DIABETES*.
