THIRTY-THIRD ANNUAL MEETING JUNE 23-24 IN CHICAGO

The Drake in Chicago, Illinois, will be the site of the Scientific Sessions of the Thirty-third Annual Meeting of the American Diabetes Association June 23-24. The Central Council will meet on Thursday, June 21, and the Board of Directors Friday, June 22.

REGISTRATION

The Scientific Sessions are open to members of the medical and allied professions. There is no registration fee for members of the Association or The Endocrine Society. The registration fee for all others is \$10.00 which includes a copy of the printed Program. Copies of the Program may be purchased at \$2.00 each. Everyone is required to register and admission is by badge only.

THE ENDOCRINE SOCIETY

The Endocrine Society will hold its Fifty-fifth annual meeting Wednesday through Friday, June 20-22, at the Conrad Hilton Hotel in Chicago. Nonmembers of that Society are required to pay a \$20.00 registration fee which includes a copy of the program. However, members of the American Diabetes Association may attend, without charge, the Friday afternoon

(carbohydrate) session *only* upon presentation of their registration badges for the Association's Thirty-third Annual Meeting or their 1973 Association membership card. Abstracts of papers to be presented, those By Title, and pertinent information will be printed in the Program. It will be published as a Supplement to the Journal and distributed without charge to members of the Professional Section of the Association and to subscribers.

Dr. Lazarow is Professor and Head, Department of Anatomy, Medical School, University of Minnesota, Minneapolis.
