- Arnold Lazarow, M.D., Ph.D., will present the Banting Memorial Lecture, entitled "Selective Islet Differentiation in Organ Culture and Islet Transplantation," at 11:30 Saturday morning, June 23, and will receive a Banting Medal. Dr. Lazarow is Professor and Head, Department of Anatomy, Medical School, University of Minnesota, Minneapolis.
- Arthur H. Rubenstein, M.D., Associate Professor of Medicine at the Pritzker School of Medicine, University of Chicago, will receive the 1973 Lilly Award for his significant contributions to research concerned with circulating proinsulin and C-peptide.
- Mrs. Vernon B. Child, Piedmont, California, will receive the Citation as an Outstanding Layman at the Central Council Dinner on Thursday, June 21. Mrs. M. J. Spiegel, Chicago, Vice President, Central Council, will present the Citation to Mrs. Child for her long years of voluntary service with the Alameda-Contra Costa Diabetes Association and with individual diabetics.

MEMBERS PARTICIPATE IN POSTGRADUATE COURSE
