COURSE ON DIABETOLOGY
IN YUGOSLAVIA

The Second European Postgraduate Course on Diabetology will be organized under the auspices of the European Association for the Study of Diabetes, the World Health Organization and the Medical Faculty of the University of Zagreb, for physicians involved in the care of diabetes, specialists in internal medicine, endocrinology and metabolic diseases.
