THIRTY-SIXTH ANNUAL MEETING JUNE 20-22 IN SAN FRANCISCO

The Hilton Hotel in San Francisco will be the site of the Scientific Sessions of the Thirty-sixth Annual Meeting of the American Diabetes Association on June 20-22. The Central Council will meet Saturday, June 19, and the Board of Directors Sunday, June 20. Pertinent information about the meeting, together with a hotel reservation card, has been mailed to the membership.

REGISTRATION

The Scientific Sessions are open to members of the medical and allied professions. There is no registration fee for members of the Association or The Endocrine Society. The registration fee for all others is \$25.00, which includes a copy of the printed Program. Copies of the Program may be purchased at \$3.00 each. Everyone is required to register, and admission is by badge only.

THE ENDOCRINE SOCIETY

The Endocrine Society will hold its fifty-eighth annual meeting at the Hilton Hotel June 23-25. Members of the American Diabetes Association will be admitted without charge to the carbohydrate session, on the afternoon of June 23, upon presentation of their badges or membership cards after registering with the Society at the hotel.

SCIENTIFIC PROGRAM

One hundred and eleven papers, in addition to the Banting Memorial Lecture and the Lilly Lecture, have been selected for presentation from among 276 abstracts submitted for consideration by the Committee on Scientific Programs, under the chairmanship of Thaddeus E. Prout, M.D., Baltimore. A Health Care Delivery Session will be held concurrently with the Scientific Sessions. Except for the Lilly Lecture, Sunday afternoon, and the Banting Memorial Lecture, concurrent sessions will be held Sunday afternoon and Monday and Tuesday mornings and afternoons, concluding at 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, June 22.

The titles of papers to be presented, those to be read By Title, and the abstracts of both (except the Banting Memorial Lecture) will be published as a Supplement to this Journal prior to the meeting. It will be distributed without charge to all Journal subscribers.

Sunday Morning Sessions

Structured sessions, with invited speakers, will be held Sunday morning, June 20, to begin the Scientific Program. The first panel, from 9:00 to 10:30 a.m., will be devoted to hyperglycemia and vascular disease. Scheduled from 10:45 a.m. to 12:15 p.m. is the second panel, "Diabetes and Pregnancy." Further details will be included in the meeting Supplement.

IX IDF CONGRESS

The Ninth Congress of the International Diabetes Federation will take place in New Delhi, India, October 31-November 5, 1976. There will be a plenary Session on the afternoon of Sunday, October 31. The Scientific Program will be built around five special lectures, 18 three-hour Panel symposia, nine three-hour workshops, and the usual Free Communication Sessions. There will be daily Poster Sessions and, on November 5, two Stop Press Sessions, for papers on significant work done since the selection of abstracts.
