The Department of Medicine, Emory University School of Medicine, is seeking a diabetologist at the assistant professorial level. This position is in the Diabetes Unit at Grady Memorial Hospital in Atlanta, Georgia. Individual selected will work with a team consisting of physicians, nurse practitioners, dietitians, and a podiatrist in providing primary health care for 8,000 patients with diabetes and will have over-all responsibility for supervising care of patients in accordance with established policies and procedures. Applicants should be board-certified in Internal Medicine and board-certified or eligible for certification in the subspecialty of Endocrinology.
