## ADA TWENTY-SIXTH POSTGRADUATE COURSE

### CAREER DEVELOPMENT AWARD IN DIABETES RESEARCH

The Juvenile Diabetes Foundation has announced the availability of a Career Development Award in Diabetes Research for the funding year July 1, 1979, to June 30, 1980. The JDF will accept applications relating to the etiology and/or the management of treatment and/or complications of diabetes in childhood. Candidates must have a doctoral degree and about four to seven years of postdoctoral clinical or research experience by the beginning of the award period. The award has a three-year term with annual re-
