NATIONAL DIABETES RESEARCH INTERCHANGE

The National Diabetes Research Interchange is a research support program established to advance the procurement, preservation, and distribution of human tissue for diabetes-related research. The NDRI provides investigators nationwide with regular access to both diabetic and nondiabetic tissues. Samples are prepared and shipped according to each researcher's specific protocol. Detailed donor information is routinely provided.

Researchers are invited to submit tissue requests for: (1) Surgical and cadaveric tissue—including kidney, liver, pancreas, eye, pituitary, heart, muscle, macrovessels, placenta, umbilical cord, and gastrointestinal specimens. Post-mortem procurement times can be carefully controlled. (2) Discard implantable tissues—including kidney, pancreas, and liver.
