EIGHTH EUROPEAN SYMPOSIUM ON HORMONES AND CELL REGULATION

The Eighth European Symposium on Hormones and Cell Regulation will be held in Sainte-Odile,

France (near Strasbourg) September 26-30, 1983. The aim of this symposium is to present reviews of recent advances in general lectures and communications of recent unpublished results in posters, both being analyzed at length in general discussions. Topics will include cyclic AMP, cyclic GMP, and calcium as signals; control of intermediary metabolism by insulin; neurochemistry; steroids and gene expression; control of cell multiplication by growth factors; and signals in development and differentiation.
