ADA 1986 ABSTRACT DEADLINE

ADA RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT AWARD

Applications for Research and Development Awards for the academic years 1986-87 and 1987-88 are due December 2, 1985. The following policies regarding this award have been established by the Committee on Research.

ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must be members of university-affiliated institutions within the United States or U.S. possessions, and be a U.S. citizen or have permanent resident status; have an M.D. or Ph.D. degree, or in the case of other health professions, an appropriate advanced degree; have at the time of the award a minimum of two, and preferably no more than five years of post-doctoral research experience with relevant diabetes-related accomplishments and publications (time spent in residency training is not considered equivalent to research experience); agree to devote at least 80 percent of time and effort to their research project during the period of the award, and be a member or agree to become a member of the National Professional Section of the American Diabetes Association if funded.

STIPEND: Support is for a period of two years and is non-renewable. Salary stipend is \$25,000 per year plus the customary fringe benefits of the sponsoring institution for which the recipient of the award qualifies. The institution may supplement the salary to the level appropriate to the institution. Research grant support will be \$15,000 in each of the two years. These funds are intended to defray the support each year of a technician and/or for supplies, with travel for the recipient restricted to a maximum of \$1,000 and equipment restricted to a maximum of \$1,000. A recipient will not be eligible to receive a separate American Diabetes Association Feasibility Grant during the term of the Development Award.

TERM: The award will be made for two academic years, from July 1 to June 30, but the funding of the second year is dependent upon the approval by the Committee on Research of the recipient's research progress report.

NOMINATIONS FOR LILLY AWARD DUE DECEMBER 13, 1985

The 1986 Lilly Award will be given at the forty-sixth Annual Meeting of the American Diabetes Association. The following stipulations govern the contest for this annual award, which is supported by Eli Lilly and Company and consists of \$2,000 and a medal.

PURPOSE: To recognize demonstrated research in the field of diabetes, taking into consideration independence of thought and originality.

ELIGIBILITY: Any investigator in an appropriate field of work closely related to diabetes who is less than forty years of age on January 1, 1986. The research will not necessarily be judged in comparison with the work of more mature and experienced workers. The candidate should be a resident of the United States or Canada.

NOMINATION: Nominations for the award will be solicited from members of the American Diabetes Association. Such nominations will be requested by repeated notices to be published in *Diabetes* and *Diabetes Care*. Nominations must be received prior to December 13, 1985. The nominations should be accompanied by full information concerning the nominee's personality, training, and research work. Fifteen copies of each item should be submitted. No member may send in more than one nomination.

The nominee should be actively engaged at that time in the line of research for which the award is to be made. Nominations should be addressed to the Committee on Research, American Diabetes Association, Inc., 2 Park Avenue, New York, New York 10016.

AWARD: In addition to the monetary award and medal, travel expenses will be given to make it possible for the recipient to receive the award in person at the Annual Meeting.

ANNOUNCEMENT: The name of the winner will be announced in *Diabetes* and *Diabetes Care*; the winner will be invited to present a paper on his or her work at the Annual Meeting's Scientific Sessions.

LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL RESEARCH PROGRAM

The American Diabetes Association is proud to have been selected once again to administer the Lions Clubs International Research Program for 1986. This program funds research grants in the United States and throughout the world. Grants are restricted to research related to **diabetic retinopathy** and may be in the form of Pilot and Feasibility Grants, Research and Development Awards, and Fellowships. ADA FEASIBILITY GRANT PROGRAM

Applications for Feasibility Grants from the American Diabetes Association are due February 3, 1986 for funding beginning August 1, 1986. Applications for two years of support for amounts up to \$25,000 per year will be considered. Funding for the second year is dependent upon the approval by the Committee on Research of the recipient's progress report and budget. Grants are limited to institutions within the United States and U.S. possessions. These grants carry no commitment for overhead costs or tuition. The funds may **not** be used for training stipends, postdoctoral fellowships, professional salaries, or other nontechnical salaries. Otherwise, the funds are unencumbered other than that they are to be used in research activities relating to diabetes mellitus for the project described in the year of the award. The funds may be used for equipment and/or supplies and/or salary for technical assistance. Funds up to \$1,000 may also be used for travel to diabetes-related scientific meetings.

The purpose of this program is to assist investigators who want to test new and imaginative diabetes-related ideas in order to obtain preliminary data upon which a subsequent grant application could be based and submitted to NIH or other funding agencies. The program is intended primarily for new investigators without prior NIH or other significant support; for established investigators in the field of diabetes who are proposing projects which constitute a major departure from their ongoing research; or for established investigators in other fields who are proposing projects in which they will transfer their special expertise to diabetes-related research. Investigators who have previously received pilot and feasibility money may not reapply for such funding in the same area of work.

ADA/NAASO JOINT CONFERENCE ON OBESITY AND NON-INSULIN-DEPENDENT DIABETES MELLITUS

A research conference on Obesity and Non-Insulin-Dependent Diabetes Mellitus, presented by the American Diabetes Association and the North American Association for the Study of Obesity, will be held October 30-November 1, 1985 at the Inn on the Park Hotel in Toronto, Ontario.
