### SYMPOSIUM ON HORMONES AND CELL REGULATION

Institut National de la Santé et de la Recherche Médicale (INSERM) is sponsoring the 11th European Symposium on Hormones and Cell Regulation, September 29 to October 2, 1986, in Sainte-Odile (near Strasbourg), France.
