ADA MEDICAL STUDENT RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

The American Diabetes Association has initiated a Medical Student Research Fellowship Program to promote medical student interest in careers of clinical investigation or basic research in diabetes. This a program award to be given for a period of up to five years. The amount of the awards will be limited to \$12,000–25,000 per year in direct costs. No indirect costs will be funded.

Eligibility Requirements. The applicant institution must be an accredited medical school in the U.S. The program director must be a member of the ADA's Professional Section and should have a demonstrated record of success in conducting research and in working with research trainees. The students selected by the applicant institution to participate in the program must be U.S. citizens or noncitizen nationals of the U.S., or must have been lawfully admitted for permanent residency at the time of appointment. They must be students in good standing in an accredited medical school in the U.S. and must have completed at least one year of medical school.

Application. Application should be made on forms provided by ADA. Each applicant institution should develop a proposal that is best suited to its own strengths and characteristics. The overall training is not necessarily restricted to activities in a single discipline or department. The choice of participating training sites and mentors should be carefully described to show that the institution's best environments and role models have been selected. No awards will be made to support fewer than 5 trainees per year. Adjustments in numbers of trainees may be made for different periods of appointment within the range of 2–4 months. All training must be full time during the specific training sequence.

Budget. A proposed budget must be provided in the application. Student stipends must comprise at least 80% of the budget, with the amount of the stipend set by the applicant institution. Funds from the ADA may be used to pay the entire stipend or to supplement other funds.

Terms. Funds will be paid to the institution in three equal payments for five years, however, funding for each successive year after the first is contingent upon approval of the recipient institution's progress report, as well as the availability of funds.

Review Criteria. All applications will be peer reviewed by the ADA's Research Review Committee. Particular attention will be paid to: the proposed training program and the qualifications of the program director and participating mentors; the training environment; the institution's commitment to the training of investigators in basic and clinical research; and proposed methods of selection and assignment of students.

Submission. The deadline for receipt of applications is 18 September 1987, to be considered for funding beginning 1 January 1988.
