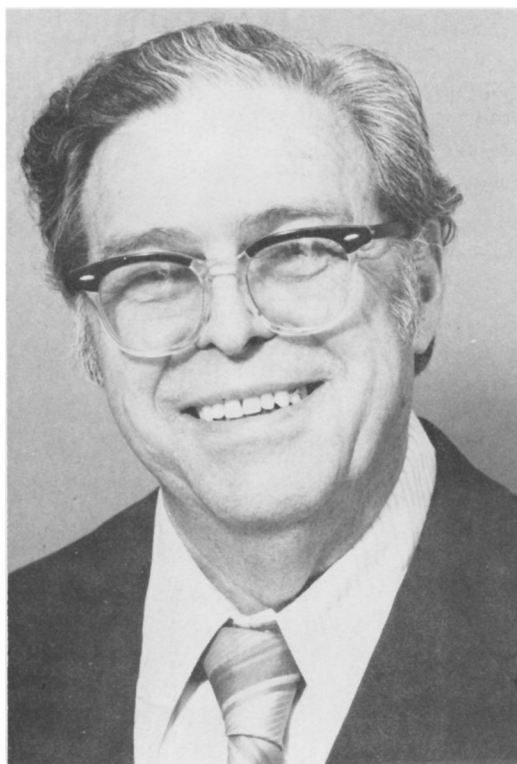


## Addison E. Lee Elected Honorary Member of NABT



The Saturday evening banquet at last month's convention in Anaheim was the occasion for the announcement that Addison E. Lee has been elected an Honorary Member of the National Association of Biology Teachers. This is the highest recognition the Association can confer on an individual, and the Board of Directors was unanimous in its choice.

Dr. Lee, a witty, wise, and intellectually vigorous Texan has long been an articulate spokesperson for education in the biological sciences. His over forty years of teaching and writing has had and continues to have great impact. More than 100 publications attest to his wide range of interests that include curriculum innovations and research in the area of plant growth and development.

Lee, professor of science education and biology and director of the Science Education Center at the University of Texas, Austin, is currently Chairperson of the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee of the Biological Sciences Curriculum Study (BSCS). He earned his Ph.D. from the University of Texas, Austin, in 1949. A Past President of NABT (1973), Lee has held elective office in numerous national education associations and has served as a consultant to many national and international conferences and agencies. He has received several awards both for science and education and is listed in *American Men of Science* and *Who's Who in America*.
