The values for the year 1970 in Table 6 (Trends in occupational segregation from 1970–2009 by age and education categories, 2000 occupation codes) are incorrect. The corrected values are in the table below.

Resulting Changes to the Text

1. On the page following the table, in the second full paragraph starting on line 4, the corrected sentence should read:

“For example, the workers in age group 25–34 in 1970 were in age group 35–44 in 1980 and had a 4.7-point decline in occupational segregation.”

2. Also on the page following the table, the last sentence on the page should read:

“Each year provides some evidence of a negative relationship between education and occupational segregation, with college-educated women less segregated than high school graduates and high school dropouts, and those with a college degree less segregated than those with less education.”

3. Two pages after the table, in the first full paragraph starting on line 7, the corrected sentence should read:

“Between 1970 and 2009, the segregation index declined by fully 21.4 percentage points among those with college degrees, compared with decreases of 9.9 percentage points for those with some college, 8.5 percentage points for those with just a high school education, and 5.5 percentage points for high school dropouts.”
