

A CORRECTION

In the August number of the *Journal of Cancer Research*, volume xiv, 1930, page 476, there is an error in the interpretation of a paper by G. Hevesy and O. H. Wagner. When my paper was written, the original article was not accessible, and I assumed from the abstract in *Nature* that the authors' statement meant that no lead could be found in transplanted animal tumors. On consulting the original article, since my paper went to press, I find that the authors show that a considerable quantity of lead was found in the tumors and simply make the statement that there is no selective fixation of lead by the tumors. My criticism of their work, therefore, is entirely unjustified.

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
