Congress Opening

The inaugural session will take place on Sunday afternoon, September 7th. The scientific sessions begin on Monday, 9:00 A.M.

Official languages

Official Congress languages: English, French, German, Italian, Spanish.

Main subjects

Main subjects of the Congress are: (1) Immunohematology; (2) Hemorrhagic syndromes; (3) Leukemia; (4) The spleen and the reticuloendothelial system; (5) Anemia; (6) Radioactive isotopes in Hematology.

Registration

For registration to the Congress fill in *form A* and send it to: Segreteria del VII Congresso della Società Internazionale di Ematologia, Istituto di Patologia Medica—Policlinico Umberto I—Rome (Italy).

To facilitate the organizational work, please submit form A not later than June 20, 1958.

After having remitted the registration fee of the Congress, participants receive a membership card which entitles them to attend the scientific sessions, the exhibitions and the social manifestations. Furthermore, they receive the final program and a volume containing the summaries of the main papers and communications, presented at the Congress. Family members can be registered as associated members of the Congress, whereupon they are entitled to attend the scientific sessions and the social events of the Congress.

Fees and registration formalities are quoted in the enclosed form A.

Formalities for the presentation of a paper

Active Congress members, who wish to present a communication, are requested to submit *form B*, duly filled in, together with a short summary to the Secretary's Office not later than June 15, 1958. Summaries arriving here afterwards cannot be included in the publication of the final program. For the sake of a satisfactory simultaneous translation service four copies of the whole text of the paper should be submitted to the Secretary's Office not later than August 15, 1958.

Formalities for a scientific exhibition

The scientific exhibition will be arranged on the first floor of the Reception Hall of the Congress Building, namely in the openings between the pillars. These openings are of the following dimension: 2.40 M. height (calculated from the bottom), 4.00 M. length, 0.50 M. depth, are outfitted with large lined plywood frames for the arrangement of diagrams, photographs, etc. Probably there are also tables of different lengths and 0.50 M. breadth, as admitted by the depth of the space, at the disposal of exhibitors. Upon request, larger

tables can be arranged in adjacent areas. The space available in each opening is divided in units of 100 x 80 cm., and exhibitors may dispose of one or more units.

Congress members interested in the scientific exhibition receive upon request a prospective sketch and a scheme outlining the spaces to be used. Together with application form C they should submit a typewritten description (five copies) of their exhibition of no more than 150 words and a sketch of their exhibition indicating dimensions of the needed space. The application form should reach the Secretariat of the Congress by June 15, 1958.

Space and standard illumination are gratuitous, whereas the arrangement of material and special equipment, eventually requested, are at the charge of the exhibitor. The arrangement of the material may begin on September 1st and must be completed by 9:00 A.M. of September 8, 1958. A special office will be at the disposal of participants giving all necessary information as to time and formalities set up for the arrangement of material.

Formalities for film projection

Active Congress members, who wish to present a film have to fill in *form D* and send it to the Secretary's Office not later than June 15, 1958.

For the various film types quoted in form D the Organizing Committee arranges for the projection equipment. Only non-inflammable films are admissible. Though films will be handled by specialized personnel, the Organizing Committee will not take any responsibility for eventual damages which are liable to occur during the projection or at any time during the storing period. Films of propagandistic and commercial character are not admitted in sessions dedicated to scientific films.

The Holy Father, Pius XII, will grant a special Audience to all Congress members. (Time and place to be announced during the Congress.) Opera at the Auditorium of the R.A.I.

A special *Ladies' Programme* consisting of sightseeings of Rome, visits to Museums, excursions to the excavations at Ostia Antica, Villa Adriana and Villa d'Este at Tivoli and to the beach of Ostia will be arranged.

Travel Organization

Congress participants will be granted a 20% reduction on the Italian and French railway net. Applications to be made through the local Wagons-Lits/Cook agencies.

All Wagons-Lits/Cook branches act as official agents for the touristical organization of the Congress. Provided that Congress members entrust their travel and hotel arrangement for Rome to the Wagons-Lits/Cook agencies, their offices and correspondents throughout the world are entitled to make reservations for all those who wish to attend the Congress, and to give their assistance as concerns the following:

(1) Collecting registration fees; (2) Assistance in obtaining visas; (3) Information on foreign exchange; sale and endorsement of travellers' cheques, credit letters or other negotiable bills; (4) Information on available travel facilities, customs regulations, exactable duties in foreign ports, vaccination certificates; (5) Transportation by boat, plane and railway to and from Rome; (6) Seat and berth reservation on trains; (7) Room reservation during the journey; (8) Insurance on accidents and on luggage; (9) Luggage dispatching; (10) Assistance from Wagons-Lits/Cook representatives or interpreters at important stations, ports and airports; (11) Organization of independent excursions, all expenses included; (12) Organization of touristical visits in important centers; (13) Renting of private cars, with chauffeur; (14) Organization of individual excursions of any kind, upon conclusion of the Congress.

Since there is usually a large number of tourists in Rome during the month of September, it will be necessary that requests for reservations be made out on attached *form E* as early as possible. This form is to be sent in to Wagons-Lits/Cook (Via Nizza 128, Rome) by June 30, 1958; the company declines any responsibility for reservation requests made after that date.
