

NOTE ON THE TEXT

We have, when using the general category of “indigenous,” used lowercase throughout this study, reserving the use of capitals for our reference to specific indigenous peoples: Indigenous Australians, Native Americans, Māori. We follow the convention in current New Zealand English of using macrons for Māori words to indicate a double vowel. However, Māori words in the titles of books, organizations, and so on and in historical archival sources and texts have been left in their original form. *Aotearoa* is the Māori name for the North Island of New Zealand. While the country remains formally “New Zealand,” we use the double appellation *Aotearoa/New Zealand* where appropriate to reflect increasing formal use of this term in bilingual references to national institutions and in other official state contexts.
